Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

We began the week gathering together for a remembrance liturgy including a two-minute silence to mark the 11<sup>th</sup> hour, of the 11<sup>th</sup> day in the 11<sup>th</sup> month. Staff, Year 5 and Year 6 led the liturgy, we reflected on the poignancy of remembrance, listened to scripture, offered prayers to God and sang collectively.



On Tuesday we excitedly came to school in odd-socks to mark the start of anti-bullying week, this year the theme of the week was 'choose respect'. We were very lucky to be visited by Blu from the band 'Andy and the Odd Socks' (aka Mr Ramtohl) who performed live music for the children, sharing the important message of showing respect to everyone. Taking part in odd-socks day enables us to live out and celebrate Catholic social teaching- we all have human dignity because we were made in the image and likeness of God, everyone deserves respect, something that Jesus showed us time and time again during His life on earth. Thank you, Blu, for bringing this message to St Teresa's for anti-bullying week 2024.

Linking in with the theme of 'choose respect' we have launched a new 'diversity library' resource this week at school. Our pop-up library features a collection of books, dolls, posters and resources that relate to celebrating diversity. Our aim is to fill our library with dolls and books that represent the rich diversity of pupils and staff that we have in our school. If you would like to donate a doll, book or resource to the collection we would be delighted to receive it.

We went from 'odd-socks Tuesday' to 'pajama Friday' with Your Voice's 'Children in Need' fundraising. Thank you to everyone who wore their pajamas to school to raise money for this wonderful charity.

In sporting news, 49 pupils from across KS2 took part in a local cross-country event. As you can imagine organizing the transportation of 49 pupils alongside the logistics of different races for different age groups etc. is no mean feat. Mrs Herron did a fantastic job in pulling this off without a hitch. We had some superb personal achievements with special mention to Rowan and Toby who took 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> respectively in their categories.

Another member of staff who deserves a medal for logistics is Mrs Hale- who perhaps rarely gets a mention in the newsletter but who does so much behind the scenes at school- this week organizing the logistics of flu vaccinations for over 200 pupils overcoming barriers of lunch times, school trips and finding space for the nurses to work. Well done to all the children who braved the nose spray and got their vaccination.

Parents of children who use one of our new spaces in school- the Hive- joined us for a tea party on Thursday. Ms Pamment allowed us all to join in a session of Attention Autism and pupils interacted in the new space, the Harbour, with sensory and play-based activities. It was wonderful to share with parents how these spaces and our SEND provision is evolving.

Today it was wonderful to celebrate mass with the parish alongside our Mini Vinnies, led by Miss Hilton, who were commissioned into their Mini-Vinnie roles. It was a proud Headteacher moment!

Please do keep reading to find out more about parent surveys- thank you to the 33 responses so far for the general feedback survey, if you haven't fed back to us please do- we value your thoughts and we really want to hear from ALL families. There is now a second parent survey, again details overleaf, which relates to tentatively gauging interest in potentially extending our age-range to provide a school-based nursery provision at St Teresa's.


