Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

We began the week thinking about the word 'responsibility'. What does it mean to have a responsibility? Do we take responsibility for ourselves, others, or both? We looked at some photos taken from around the school. The children identified the areas and we discussed whose responsibility it was to look after these areas.

Next, we turned to scripture and listened to the story of Zacchaeus- the cheating tax collector who wanted to see Jesus but was so ashamed of his poor behavior and the crowd's reaction he hid in a tree. Jesus chose Zacchaeus to dine with and Zacchaeus took responsibility for his past behavior. He said sorry and gave back what he'd stolen. We looked at some images of behavior and thought about- who has responsibility for our behavior? We asked God to help us grow in our ability to take responsibility for our actions this week at school.



On Wednesday we wore red to mark RED WEDNESDAY and attended Mass- this national event raises awareness for persecuted Christians around the world.

Pope Francis spoke this week about education stating: 'School is, first and foremost, a place where one learns to open both mind and heart to the world'. Reflecting on this statement I feel great privilege to be leading a school that does just this. Curiosity, opening the mind, is very much the driver of our academic curriculum but equally so, opening the heart, is weaved through assemblies, worship, RE, and our very mission. Pope Francis also said, 'the key to education is good school-family collaboration' and with that in mind, I wanted to extend my thanks for the support and collaboration we get week-in-week-out from you all.

Thank you to those parents who have completed our parent survey- this is a great way for us to collaborate and learn from parents. There is some very positive feedback which we greatly appreciate if nothing more than to reassure us we are doing a good job! We're always striving to make things the best they can be so we were also grateful for some feedback in terms of improvement- these comments were quite individualized but the Senior Leadership will read every comment and if improvements can be made, they will. The vast majority of parents feel that concerns, if raised, are dealt with quickly and effectively. I would like to remind parents that, if you have shared concern and you feel a suitable resolution hasn't been found, please do bring it my attention- it would be very rare indeed that a solution, compromise or action cannot be made to address a concern.

A second survey has also been available to gauge early opinion on the prospect of developing nursery provision at St Teresa's. The feedback for this has been overwhelmingly positive with 96% of responses believing this could benefit the community and 100% of responses who require a future nursery space saying they would use the provision if it existed. This is certainly an exciting prospect if we can secure funding. Watch this space!

I'm delighted to introduce a new member of staff to you all, Miss Ingram is our new Senior EYFS LSA and will be working in Reception full-time.

We were very excited at the arrival of the Book Fair at school today. Next week, every day after school the Book Fair is open for you to buy some books. Come along and see what is on offer!

Also coming up next week- Year 6 parent's evenings, Year 5 trip to Duxford... and one of the absolute highlights of this term- the BCCS Joint Schools Christmas Concert coming up on Friday. Tickets are still available from the school office- it really is an AMAZING show!
