Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

Mrs Hever is loved by everyone and we will miss her terribly but we equally want to wish her the very best in her retirement.

## Safer Internet Day!

“We are called to empower communities, to let everyone have a say”



This week our Global Assembly was on Tuesday because our focus was Safer Internet Day! Mrs Herron led us in a very important assembly on how we can keep ourselves safe online. This year's focus is 'Too good to be true? – Protecting yourself and others from scams online'. Mrs Herron spoke about how being online can be so much fun, but that the internet can be a dangerous place in which very unkind people try to 'scam' others and take their personal information! She reminded everyone that trusted adults are there to help keep us safe and that we should ask for their help if we are unsure of something when using one of our devices. The children reflected on who their trusted adults are in school, at home, in clubs etc. Mrs Herron also reminded us to keep our personal information personal and not share it online because that is how scammers achieve their goals! We thought about how we can use our voice for change and to not be worried about being 'told off' for reporting an online concern to our trusted adults, because by using our voice we are making a good choice and supporting change. We thought about our Catholic Social Teaching character – Sid the Sheep and how he reminds us that everyone should have a say and use their voice for empowerment! Please do remind your children that they should report any concerns to you and that you are there to protect them whilst they are navigating an online world.







## St Helena Hospice Hero Run


