Classroom Locations 2025-26

I've received questions about where our nursery will be based next year and what that means for other classes, hopefully this will help clarify the plan!

We're delighted to let you know about some exciting developments at St Teresa's as we prepare for the launch of our brand-new nursery class this September! Thanks to a successful government capital bid, we've been awarded funding to create a dedicated nursery space **within** our existing school building. The grant is specifically for **refurbishment** rather than new build work, so we've taken time to carefully plan how best to adapt our current layout.


As some of you may know, St Teresa's was previously a one-and-a-half form entry school, which has left us with a few spare classrooms in recent years. We're now in the wonderful position of being able to use these spaces to support our expansion. Here's what's planned:

- ~ Next year's Year 1 class will move into the current resources room, giving them direct access to an outdoor space and greater opportunities for continuous provision.
- ~ Year 2 will be based in what is currently the Year 1 classroom. This means that our KS1 classes will once again be located side by side, supporting a more cohesive and connected flow across the phase.
- ~ Reception will move into the current Year 2 room, which will be refurbished with improved access and an outdoor area as part of the government-funded work.
- ~ Our new nursery class will be based in the current Reception classroom, which will be redesigned and upgraded both internally and externally to suit the needs of younger children.
- ~ KS2 classrooms remain unchanged

This thoughtful reorganisation will mean our entire Early Years provision – nursery and Reception – will sit together in one part of the school, and Year 1 and 2 will be placed side-by-side, helping us to create an engaging and nurturing environment for all our youngest learners.

We couldn't be more excited about the positive impact these changes will bring. We've got a busy summer of building and refurbishment ahead – but we're so looking forward to the transformation and to welcoming our very first nursery children, and our new Reception pupils in September!



Walk to School Week



“We are guardians of God’s creation, living sustainably and enhancing the wellbeing of our planet.”

Pope Francis, *Laudato Si’*



Our Global Assembly focus this week was all about Walk to School Week which is a National challenge that takes place next week. Children and adults are encouraged to walk to school for lots of different reasons. Next week our daily focuses as we walk to school will be nature, movement, happiness, friendship and community. Walk to School week also helps us to look after our planet, just like Pope Francis asked us to do in *Laudato Si’*. By walking or wheeling to school, we are stopping the build up of traffic, exploring the natural world around us and stopping pollution. Children and staff are encouraged to walk or wheel to school, even if just a little bit more than they usually would (parking a short distance away from school if walking from home is not possible) and collecting stickers each day. We learned that children should have 60 minutes of exercise daily and that exercise helps us in so many different ways. Both Sofia the Sloth and Patariki the Penguin helped us remember that we are responsible for our common home and by working together we can do great things!


