Dear Parent's, Carers and Friends,

We began the week thinking about the new commandment Jesus left us with, 'love one another, as I have loved you'. We wondered at the love God has for each one of us and thought about how we can show love to each other. We listened to the story of the good Samaritan thinking about how the Samaritan showed great love, even to someone who could have been considered an enemy. School tours- we have hosted three open days this week, offering tours of the school aimed at promoting the nursery and our remaining Reception places. Our tours continue after half term, do tell your friends and family and encourage them to drop-in to see for themselves what makes our school so very special.

Year 6 met with Mr Fusi and Mrs Jennings from St Benedict's this week as part of their transition support. The children asked some brilliant questions. Secondary has crept up on us and now of course it is quite real and just around the corner. We will continue with more transition opportunities after half term ensuring the children are well prepared for the next step.

Sports news- we hosted a netball home game vs Heathlands on Monday and played an away football match on Tuesday vs Bishop William Ward School. We are proud of our children each and every time they represent our school.

Thank you to the parents that attended our SEND coffee afternoon on Friday. I hope you found the opportunity to meet comforting and informative. It was wonderful to see so many parents attending our RE celebrations this week too.

FOST held a school disco on Thursday- it was the talk of the playground today along with 'Break the Rules' non-uniform! A half term raffle was held this week as well- raising around £400 towards outdoor learning, prizes were awarded during merit assembly- congratulations to the lucky winners and thank you so much to everyone who bought a ticket and supported our fundraising! Preparations continue for FOST FEST- the donations box will be back on the playground after half term.

Premises update- Reception class came in to a new lawn on Monday, this is part of our nursery refurbishment. We were successful in gaining a capital grant for inclusion from the LA- this involved creating 'The Hive' a dedicated space for our higher needs SEND pupils, 'The Harbour' a space to support our pastoral work and SEMH (Social Emotional and Mental Health) and 'The Hub'. 'The Hub' is the final part of our project to complete- it will see a new SENCo Office, a dedicated space for learning interventions to take place- including NESSY, NELI, Number Stacks, Toe-by-Toe and many more. 'The Hub' is within the IT suite and has been carefully designed to be multi-functional. We will still have a suite of computers! We have also had a new eco feature installed- a SUDs planter- more on that after half term.

Do have a wonderful half-term break. We look forward to welcoming you back to school on Monday 2nd June.

Some Breakfast Club news

We have been running our Universal Free Breakfast Club trial for a half term. We hope the opportunity has been well received and we'd love to hear any feedback from parents to pass to the DfE. If you would like to access Universal Free Breakfast Club please speak to Mrs Moclair in the Office who can add this as an option on Parent Pay. For the time being, bookings are still required for UFBC.

We have been monitoring our numbers as part of the trial and as such after half term we will be changing where our Breakfast Clubs are placed. We know we only recently changed this for some children however as part of the trial of Universal Free Breakfast Club we need to try a variety of models to support feedback to the DfE. We do appreciate your understanding and cooperation.

After half term:

- Universal Free Breakfast Club will be based in the **Church Hall** (for all universal children in EYFS, KS1 or KS2). Universal opens from 8:15am and runs till register time at 8:45am.
- **Early Bird** will be based in the **school hall**- that's all Early Bird children in EYFS, KS1 or KS2. Early Bird opens from 7:30am. Parents are welcome to park in the school carpark for drop-offs between 7:30am and 8am (but not after 8am please due to staff access)

We will trial this set up for the remainder of the summer term.

Catholic Social Teaching Corner



Jesus taught that when we feed the hungry, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, look after the sick and visit those imprisoned, we are looking after Him.

Our Global Assembly focus this week was World Hunger Day and was led by Mrs Gill. We began by focusing on the Catholic Social Teaching - putting people most in need first (Preferential Option for the Poor. Mrs Gill began with a quote from Pope Francis:

“The measure of the greatness of a society is found in the way it treats those most in need, those who have nothing apart from their poverty!”

Pope Francis, 26 July 2013

We learned about how communities around the world for example in Nicaragua, Mozambique, Cambodia where people often struggle to find the basics despite working hard to grow and supply food and produce that is exported around the world. We thought about whether it was fair that some countries go without whilst others have more than they need. We discussed what malnutrition is and the impact that food waste can have on our planet. We can help tackle hunger by working together to create a better world where everyone has enough to eat. Some members of Year 6 explained to us what World Hunger Day focuses on and how we can help those less fortunate than ourselves. They explained how CAFOD uses our donations to have a positive impact on those in need and how we could aspire to grow up and take on roles that will help support the most vulnerable people in our global society.
