Dear Parents and Carers

It is that time of year again when Mrs Maguire is away on a Headteacher Conference and I have the wonderful task of writing to you all! When I checked with Mrs Maguire whether she wanted me to add anything in my message, the top thing on her response was "please ask them not to ice me!"

This week has been very busy and when I look at the diary for the weeks ahead, it seems as though it is going to get busier and busier as we journey towards the end of Summer term. This week Year 4 took part in the Multiplication Table Check and I know that Mrs Herron was very proud of the children for being so sensible and for trying their best! Next week is another jammed pack week with sports week throughout, Reception's trip to Highwoods, Year 6's tour of Colchester, Reception New Intake Meeting and of course culminating in the EVENT OF THE YEAR, FOST FEST. I know that FOST are busy getting ready for the day and would love extra hands to bring their vision to life. They do such an amazing job planning this event and the staff and children of the school are always so grateful for the contributions made. # Catholic Social Teaching Corner



**The common good is about respecting the rights and responsibilities of all people and leaving none behind.**

Our Global Assembly this week was led by Mrs Gill and focused on Empathy Day! Mrs Gill welcomed the children into the hall with a piece of music which encouraged them to think about the importance of being there for your friends and family – ‘Lean on Me’ by Bill Withers. In this piece of music, the lyrics ‘Lean on me, when you’re not strong and I’ll be your friend, I’ll help you carry on, for, it won’t be long ‘til I’m gonna need somebody to lean on.’ These words remind us of the importance of friendship and having someone that you know you can lean on and who will show you empathy. Mrs Gill read the scripture of the Good Samaritan to the children and she encouraged the children to reflect on who helped the stranger and who simply walked on by.

**We are called to work for the good of each and of all.**

Mrs Gill explored the meaning of empathy and how we can all show it in our lives. She also encouraged the children to think about the difference empathy makes to other’s lives and how we can do little things to make a big impact on the lives of others, which is how God wants us to live our lives. With the help of Chikondi, Mrs Gill reminded the children of the Catholic Social Teaching – Common Good and encouraged the children to think about Chikondi and how she reminds us that what we do affects everyone and how, when we make decisions, for example a decision on how we are going to act towards others, we should think about the good of everyone.



## Mini Athletics




