

Creator – Christians believe that God, as creator, made the world.

Steward – someone who takes care of something on behalf of someone else.

Stewardship – religious belief that we should protect the earth and everything in it, as God’s care takers.

Preserve – to keep safe from injury, harm or destruction.

Sustainable – the idea that humans must interact with the environment in a way that ensures there will be enough resources left for future generations.
