
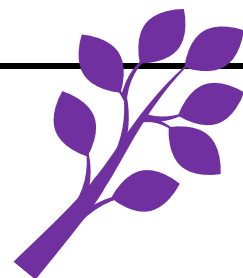

Keywords	Key Scripture
<p>Jesus – the Son of God</p> 	<p>And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid Mary, for you have found favour with God". Luke 1: 30</p>  <p>While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them. Luke 2: 6-7</p>
<p>Annunciation – the announcement by Angel Gabriel to Mary that she would have a son called Jesus and he will be the Son of God.</p> 	
<p>Visitation – The visit Mary made when pregnant with Jesus to her cousin Elizabeth.</p> 	
<p>Gloria – sang by the angels from heaven for the birth of Christ on earth.</p>

- the story of the Annunciation when Mary was chosen by God
- the words in the prayer 'Hail Mary'
- the messages that are sent by God and shared by angels
- the Nativity story

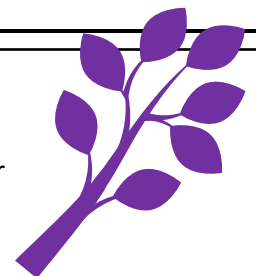

Keywords	Key Scripture
<p>Preparing – Getting ready.</p>	<p>A voice cries out, 'Prepare in the wilderness a road for the Lord! Clear the way in the desert for our God!... Then the glory of the Lord will be revealed, and the whole human race will see it. The Lord himself has promised this.'</p> <p>Isaiah 40: 3, 5-6</p> 
<p>Advent - the first season of the Church year, leading up to Christmas and including the four Sundays.</p>	
<p>Christmas – Celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ.</p>	
<p>Nativity– The story of birth of Jesus Christ.</p>	
<p>Annunciation – Mary is told she is going to have a baby by Angel Gabriel.</p>	
<p>Visitation – Mary goes to visit her cousin Elizabeth.</p>	<p>And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High.</p> <p>Luke 1 30-31.</p>

During this unit I will explore ...

- how God had prepared His people for the coming of His Son, the Messiah over many hundreds of years.
- how Advent is a time of preparation to celebrate Jesus' first coming on earth. It also reminds people that he will come again at the end of time.
- the Nativity, one of the main events in the life of Jesus – including key people and places

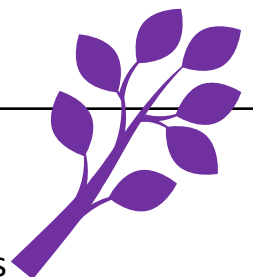



Year 3	Autumn Term Branch 2
Keywords	Key Scripture
<p>Mass – celebration of the sacrament of the Eucharist.</p>	<p>‘She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins’. Matthew 1:20</p>  <p>‘And of the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested’. Genesis 2:2</p> 
<p>Sunday – the 7th day of the week, known as Holy Day. A day of rest.</p>	
<p>Advent – the time leading up to Christmas.</p>	
<p>Joseph – the father, on earth, of Jesus.</p>	
<p>angels – messengers of God who appear to humans.</p>	
<p>Liturgy of the Word – a gospel reading.</p>	<p>‘For Christ is born of Mary; And, gathered all above, while mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wondering love.’ Hymn – O Little Town of Bethlehem</p>
<p>Consecrated –The Holy Spirit is brought down upon the gifts and has been made sacred.</p>	

During this unit I will explore ...

- how Sunday is a Holy Day for Christians.
- how Mass, Christians use special prayers, signs and preform actions focusing on the Liturgy of the Word.
- how Angels bring God’s messages. Christians must put their trust in God, like Joseph did when the angel appears.

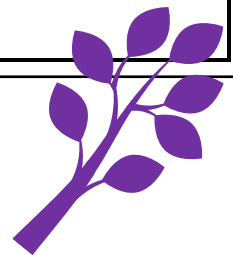



Keywords	Key Scripture
<p>Advent – the time of preparation for Christians for the birth of Jesus.</p>	<p>For thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, 'The jar of flour shall not be spend, and the jug of oil shall not be empty, until the day that the LORD sends rain upon the earth'</p> <p>Kings 17:14</p> 
<p>Prophet– a person given messages by God to share with followers</p>	
<p>Elijah – a prophet who helped people turn back to the Lord after worshipping false gods.</p>	<p>A voice cries "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God."</p> <p>Isaiah 40:3</p> 
<p>John the Baptist – sent to prepare the way for Jesus.</p>	
<p>Jesse tree – Jesus' family tree (ancestry) through images and readings.</p>	<p>John the Baptist said, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit."</p> <p>Mark 1: 7-8</p>
<p>Christ the King – a title for Jesus, who is the king of the Universe and sits at the right hand of God in heaven. This marks the end of the Church's year.</p>	

During this unit I will ...

- describe what a prophet is drawing on Elijah and John the Baptist as examples.
- compare the description of John the Baptist in Mark and Matthew's accounts and describe the beliefs about John the Baptist the gospel writers show.
- know that the feast of Christ the King marks the end of the Church's year and describe what is celebrated.
- make links with the ancestry of Jesus and the Jesse tree.

Keywords	Key Scripture	
<p>Samuel – an important figure in the Bible who served as a priest and became the first prophet and last judge in Israel.</p>	<p>Thus there were fourteen generations in all from Abraham to David, fourteen from David to the exile to Babylon, and fourteen from the exile to the Messiah. Matthew 1: 1-17</p>	
<p>David – deep Biblical roots meaning "beloved". He was the second ruler of of ancient Israel and Judah.</p>		
<p>Antiphon – a verse usually from Scripture said or sung before and after a canticle, psalm, or psalm verse as part of the liturgy</p>	<p>The king rejoices in your strength, Lord. How great is his joy in the victories you give! You have granted him his heart's desire and have not withheld the request of his lips. You came to greet him with rich blessings and placed a crown of pure gold on his head Psalm 21: 1-7</p>	
<p>anointing – rubbing with oil, typically as part of a religious ceremony</p>	<p>He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end." Luke 1: 32-33</p>	
<p>psalm – a sacred song or hymn</p>		
<p>Advent – the first season of the Church year, leading up to Christmas and including the four preceding Sundays.</p>		

During this unit I will explore ...

- the gospel passages that present Jesus as the fulfilment of the promise to David.
- how the Rosary is a prayerful reflection on the life of Christ.
- the imagery of the shepherd used in the scripture passages studied and explore how it helps explain servant leadership.
- Antiphons and explore what they represent

Keywords	Key Scripture
<p>Expectation – a strong belief that something will happen.</p>	<p>“Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love.” 1 Corinthians 16:13-14</p>
<p>Certainty – a firm conviction that something is the case.</p>	
<p>Emmanuel – God is with us.</p>	<p>They will enter Zion with singing; everlasting joy will crown their heads. Gladness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away. Isaiah 35</p> 
<p>Annunciation - the announcement of the Incarnation by the angel Gabriel to Mary.</p>	
<p>Angelus - a Roman Catholic devotion commemorating the Incarnation of Jesus and including the Hail Mary, said at morning, noon, and sunset.</p>	<p>“Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. “I am the Lord’s servant,” Mary answered. “May your word to me be fulfilled.” Then the angel left her.</p>
<p>Incarnation – ‘to take on flesh’ The Christian belief that God took human form by becoming Jesus.</p>	

During this unit I will explore ...

- the meaning of Advent and the prophecy of Isaiah concerning the expectation of the Messiah, 1 Cor16:13-14, Isaiah 35:1-6, 9, 10 and Isaiah 62:11-12
- the Angelus prayer.
- the Incarnation.
- how in John’s Gospel Jesus is referred to as the Word, John 1:14-18.
- that Christians believe that Christ will come again.
- the religious symbolism behind key aspects of Advent such as the Advent wreath, candles in the window etc.
